The presence of organised armed groups operating outside the law in Colombia hinders the implementation of programmes and projects aimed at consolidating development and, consequently, peace in the regions. For this reason, this area seeks to:

**1**

Support the early implementation of the partial agreements established at the negotiating tables with the ELN (National Liberation Army) and other armed groups, with the aim of generating trust with the communities in the territories.

**2**

Support initiatives for reducing violence, promoting peacebuilding and trust, and involving the participation of communities and civil society.

**3**

Strengthen institutional capacities and support the creation of materials for peace negotiations.

## As of 2024, there has been progress in the following:
