Throughout this report, direct actions by the Fund, through funded initiatives that contribute to the gender focus, have been included and are marked with this symbol and colour.

Since its creation, the Fund has been committed to seeking peaceful solutions so that both women and LGBTIQ+ individuals, in their condition as victims of the armed conflict, receive effective responses that accelerate development opportunities, guarantee substantive equality, and address the historical imbalances and inequality gaps that contribute to increased vulnerabilities.

Taking into account the legal and political framework established by UN Security Council Resolution 1325 (2000), which recognises the importance of women's participation as well as the inclusion of a gender perspective in peace negotiations, humanitarian planning, peacekeeping operations, and peacebuilding, the Security Council meets annually to address the issue of "women, peace, and security."

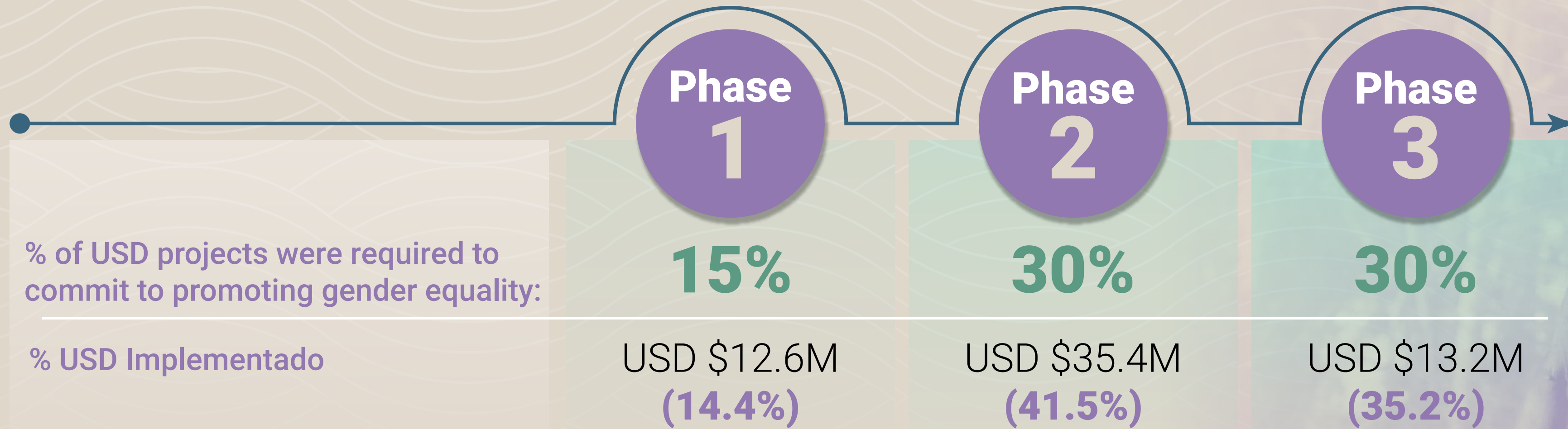
Therefore, and in line with the provisions of the Peace Agreement, the Fund pays special attention to the differentiated impacts that the armed conflict has had on the lives of women and girls. It recognises their leadership role as agents of social change and as key players in the construction of peace and reconciliation. For this reason, it supports and provides funding for projects that promote gender equality by ensuring the implementation of agreed commitments at both local and national levels, and by promoting **affirmative actions** and **transformative initiatives**.

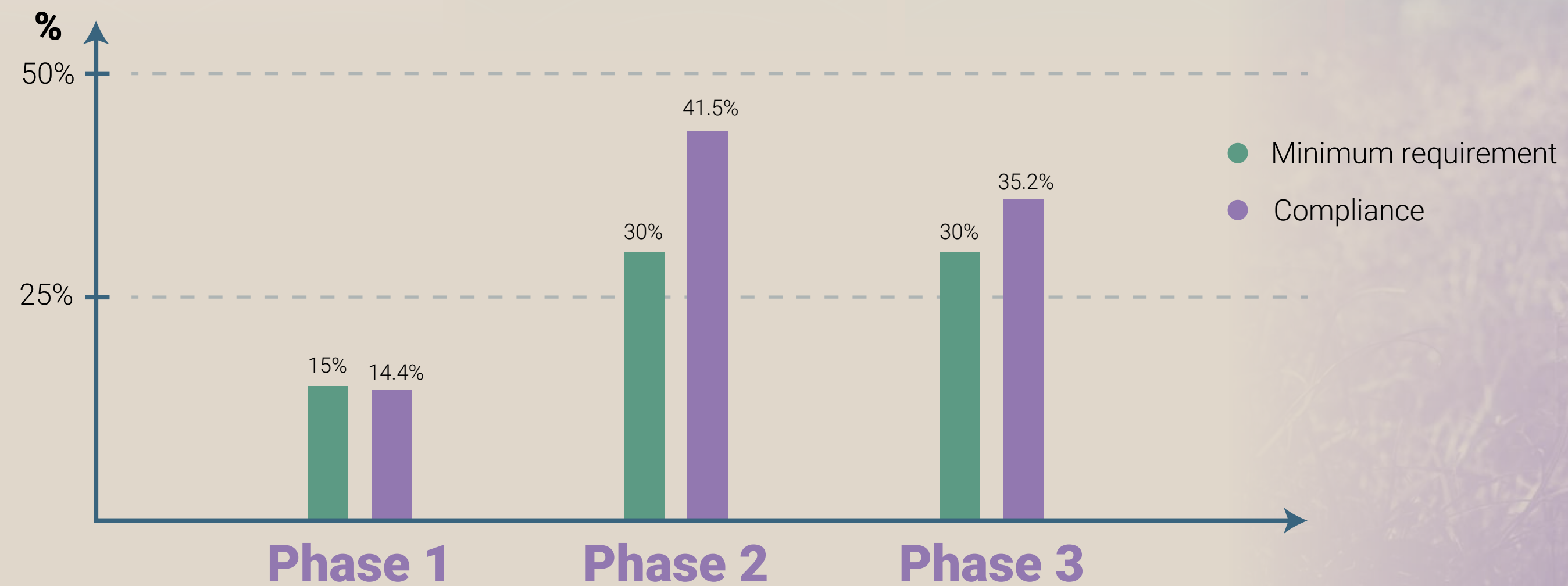
